Communication from 6/2 re: Superintendent Haley's message to families:

Seahawk Families:

I wanted to follow up on Superintendent Haley's message he sent out to the community. As I have mentioned before, Earl Warren Middle School earned designation as a "No Place for Hate" school by the Anti-Defamation League this year. I believe this only furthers our need to be leading voices against the racism, intolerance, and injustice that continues to plague our nation and our community.

At our staff meeting Monday morning, I broke down talking about my attempts to explain recent events to my nine and ten-year old children. I know how difficult it can be to talk with kids about these troubling topics, so I wanted to share with you all a resource that was created by the San Diego County Office of Education. They have created a page to house equity resources, including a section for parents. I appreciate all of you who have reached out to me with additional resources as well. The reality is that this will have to be an ongoing conversation in the Fall, and well beyond. We will continue to look for best practices to ensure that our school is a place of inclusion that proactively addresses institutionalized - and individual - acts of racism.

The challenges of addressing these issues is further complicated by distance learning; however, I know several of our staff members found ways to incorporate discussions into their "classrooms" this week that address some of these issues since those conversations fit naturally within our California Core Standards. I applaud our teachers who have taken on that challenge. As we head in to the next school year, we will strive to keep our designation as a "No Place for Hate" school, and we will continue to work with our students as they become thoughtful, caring members of our society.
