From the Principal, Justin Conn

While our students may feel otherwise, the beginning of the 2019-2020 school year at Earl Warren Middle School is right around the corner. I hope your student has had the opportunity for some rest, reflection, and relaxation over the past few weeks. My name is Justin Conn, and I am thrilled to begin my 14th year in the San Dieguito Union High School District, and second year as the principal of EWMS. Last year was a terrific learning experience for me, and I am thankful to all of the teachers, other staff, parents, and students for all you taught me over the course of my first year. I look forward to an exciting year ahead now that I have a year of practice under my belt. Our custodial and



office staff have been working diligently through the summer to ensure a smooth start to the year. Many of our teachers have taken time throughout the summer to reflect and refine their instructional practices and curriculum, and the rest will be on campus shortly doing the same.

During the 2018-19 school year, we highlighted a schoolwide focus on Engagement, Kindness, and Wellness for our students and staff. Class Schedules for Students

Students will receive their *class schedules on Opening Day, Tuesday, August 27th beginning at 7:00 a.m. in front of "The Seahawk" sculpture. Schedules are not available to students prior to the first day of school. A campus map and our bell schedule are included in this newsletter for your information.

*Schedules of students without up-to-date immunizations will be withheld.

EWMS Bell Schedule

The bell schedule at Earl Warren Middle School is a modified block schedule. Mondays are Single Period Days which means all 6 periods meet. The other days are Block Days during which only three periods meet (Tues. & Thurs. = Periods 1, 3, 5; Wed. & Fri. = Periods 2, 4, 6). One of the purposes of our block schedule is to provide students opportunities for the in-depth study of a topic that the typical 50 minute period does not allow. This schedule also maximizes student learning because we are able to reduce the number of passing periods. Since students see their core teachers three times a week it is important that they create a homework and study schedule that ensures academic success.

Zero Period students meet daily beginning at 7:20 a.m. Zero period students will not meet on late start days.

Academic Practice Time (APT)

APT is built in DAILY prior to lunch time. This time is designed for students to receive additional opportunities to complete homework, get organized, and ask questions.

Technology

Students can bring their own personal devices to school at their own risk. However, this is not a requirement as we have technology at school that students can access for educational purposes.

Cell Phone Policy

The cell phone policy at Earl Warren Middle School is the following:

Students are not permitted to use cell phones unless a teacher/staff member provides permission. This includes classroom time, passing periods, nutrition break, and visits to the restroom.

Students can use cell phones before school, lunch time, and after school as long as they are following school rules during their use and for educational purposes.

Please refrain from texting/calling your student during the instructional day to avoid infractions. If you need to contact your student, please contact the office to assist.

Any infraction of the cell phone policy will result in consequences to include warning, confiscation, parent pick up, loss of privilege, and/or suspension for ongoing infractions.

Late Start Days

This year we will have a series of Late Start Days to allow our teachers the time necessary to collaborate, analyze student data, and to continue to develop strategies to improve student achievement. Classes will begin at 9:55 a.m. on the following days:

Zero Period Students on Late Start Days

Zero period classes will NOT meet on designated late start days. Zero period students will begin 1st period classes at 9:55 a.m. with all other students. On late start days, students may arrive at the regular start time and will be supervised in The Cove. You will receive reminders about these days throughout the year.

Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA)

As you know, our schools continue to face concerns regarding the budget. Earl Warren will continue to exercise great prudence and caution with all expenditures. Please know that we are very appreciative of the support of our PTSA and their efforts to subsidize valuable programs such as After School Academic Support and Homework Hour. We also feel very fortunate that our PTSA continues to provide us with additional resources that go directly to instructional programs and to each one of our students. Despite the challenges with budget cuts, we are confident that Earl Warren Middle School will continue to provide our students with an excellent academic program.

Coffee Conn will begin Friday, October 4th and will be held from 8:30 a.m. – 9:30 a.m. in The Cove. This is a time for you to hear directly from me about what is happening at school, ask questions, and to offer feedback. Please look for announcements and join me. I will be available the first day of school from 7:45-8:45 for a "Meet the Principal" session in The Cove.

The staff and I invite you to take advantage of the many opportunities at EWMS for both you and your children to join us in building an exceptional environment for students to learn and grow. A Message From the Counselor Introducing your 2019-20 Counseling Staff

Welcome to the 2019-20 school year! As a former student of EWMS, it is an honor for me to come back and serve the students and families in the commuity where I was raised. We are very excited to start the year off with our beautiful campus and to get to know a whole new group of students. I have no doubt that this year will be another amazing and memorable one!

Please read the following important reminders:

Stay Informed: Please check out our website at http://ew.sduhsd.net/ (select the counseling link) to view material that provides you with information about the purpose of the counseling center as well as a step-by-step approach on what you can do to help your child get off on the right foot beginning the first day of school! Lots of information is posted including new parent info, progress report dates, frequently asked questions, support services provided, and School Life Balance.

Schedule Changes: Students are carefully screened to ensure they are in the proper classes (see website for details). Schedules will be distributed on the first day of school, August 27, beginning at 7:00 am. We made every effort possible to put students in their top elective choices whenever possible. Please note that there are no schedule changes unless a student was misplaced or unless it is necessary to balance class sizes. We know that schedule changes can be difficult on students and teachers, so we do our best to keep changes to a minimum.

Counselor Accessibility: I want to assist you in any way I can and as fast as I can. All phone calls will be returned by the next day and emails within 48 hours (unless I am out of the office). If you need to speak with someone as soon as possible, the counseling office support staff is available to answer questions at ext. 4410. If you would like to make an appointment with me please call ext. 4410. For students, I'm available before school, during lunch, and after school. If, after coming in during one of those times, I'm not available, I encourage students to fill out a "Request to see Counselor" pass. I will make sure I see him/her by the next day.

Student Presentations: Parents are always welcome to attend the counselor presentations on a variety of subjects throughout the year. Although the topics are geared for students, parents may also find them informative. In September, I will visit all PE classes in an effort to help them start the year off on the right foot . Students will learn about Counseling services, their confidentiality rights, study skills, how to calculate GPA, high school and college requirements and other ways to have a successful year.

Attending Back to School Night is a must! Please join us at our annual Back to School Night on Tuesday September 17, 5:30-8 p.m. Make sure you leave with the following information from each teacher: 1) How should my child get the homework if he/she is absent? 2) What is the best way to follow up on my child to make sure he/she is getting all homework turned in? 3) What is the best way to communicate with the teachers? 4) How does each teacher require students to organize their work? 5) Policy for late work? 6) What can parents do to make sure my child is successful?

READY... SET... GO! FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL August 27, 2019

Zero period classes begin at 7:20 a.m. First period begins at 8:20 a.m. Students will be able to pick up their official class schedule on the first day of school in the quad beginning at 7:00 a.m.

What supplies should I bring?

We suggest that students use a large <u>loose-leaf binder</u> to keep notes for several subjects. A few classes may suggest a separate note-book. <u>College-ruled paper</u> and some <u>pensand pencils</u> are also a good start. Because Earl Warren has <u>no lockers</u>, a <u>back-pack</u> or a <u>pack on wheels</u> will be necessary for students to carry supplies. Textbooks will be checked out by the teachers for the student to take home and use throughout the semester/year. Don't forget to pack a lunch or bring lunch money.

Where and when is APT?

Academic Practice Time is daily before lunch. Students will be given 30 minutes daily to begin their homework, study, etc. For example, students may choose to work on any subject area or may choose to quietly read a book.



Attention 7th Grade Parents

August 1, 2019

Dear Parent:

Your son/daughter is enrolled in Life Science. The curriculum includes discussion of issues that are key to adolescent development. This letter serves as notification required by the State Education Code to inform you of the reproductive health content and purpose of HIV/AIDS instruction in this course.

We are confident that the Family Life Education Unit is of optimal content and caliber, designed to provide students with accurate information regarding the following topics: decision making, refusal skills, abstinence, anatomy and physiology of reproductions, pregnancy, childbirth, and sexually transmitted infections, including HIV/AIDS.

In providing teens with a thorough and careful education about HIV/AIDS, our curriculum emphasizes that abstinence is the only 100% effective method of preventing the transmission of AIDS. As required by Ed. Code 51201.5, students will receive information on prevention, causes, symptoms, transmission, treatment, and local community resources. They will also analyze the detrimental physical, psychological, and social effects of HIV/AIDS.

As a part of this curriculum, students may have guest speakers. If a guest speaker is scheduled in the Family Life Education unit, parents will be notified of the speaker and the speaker's affiliation to outside organizations.

Parental review of written and audio-visual teaching materials will be held on September 18 at 2:50, in room 500, at Earl Warren Middle School. Teaching materials will be on display and teachers will be available to review course content. The following state-approved HIV/AIDS curriculum will be used for HIV/AIDS instruction: Positive Prevention/ American Red Cross.

We encourage and appreciate your support and look forward to your student's participation in this course.

The Solana Beach Branch of the San Diego County Library system is a shared use library, serving the community of Solana Beach, as well as the staff and students of Earl Warren Middle School. This feature allows the library to be open earlier than other public libraries, and later than other school libraries. Students must be picked up before library closing. Our new year-round hours are as follows:

Monday/Thursday 8:00 am - 6 pm Tuesday/Wednesday 8:00 am - 8 pm Friday 8:00 am - 5 pm Saturday 9:30 am - 5 pm

Each student will need a San Diego County Library card in order to check out materials. If a student already has a valid library card, they do not need to apply for a new one. To obtain a library card, each student should come into the library with a parent or legal guardian and fill out our library card application. Please note: A separate Internet Authorization Form for computer and internet use must be filled out by the parent in person in the library. I encourage parents to obtain library cards and Internet permission stickers for their students at the Seahawk Readiness Day, Thursday August 15. The library will remain open until 6:30p.m. for Readiness Day.

We would like to mention the research and reference resources available here, both in print and on-line. With a library card, students can access these via the San Diego County Library's website. Homework Help sites include Gale's *Research in Context* and *World Book Student*. Thousands of eBooks are available through Overdrive and other services, such as ordering and renewing library materials, which are also available on our web site, www.sdcl.org. We also provide a set of Earl Warren textbooks for students to do their homework while in the library.

Students are welcome in the library both before and after school. We encourage them to either do homework, socialize quietly (so as not to disturb the other customers), or participate in our after school activities. We will offer some fun programs in the Teen area beginning the second week of school:

Monday Brain Games: try some challenging brain puzzles.

Tuesday Craft Club: a variety of crafts from crochet to card making and from beading to painting Wednesday White-board Games: Hang man, Pictionary and more Game Day Thursdays Cards and various board games are available

Encourage your students to participate in Reading Challenge this Fall semester.
