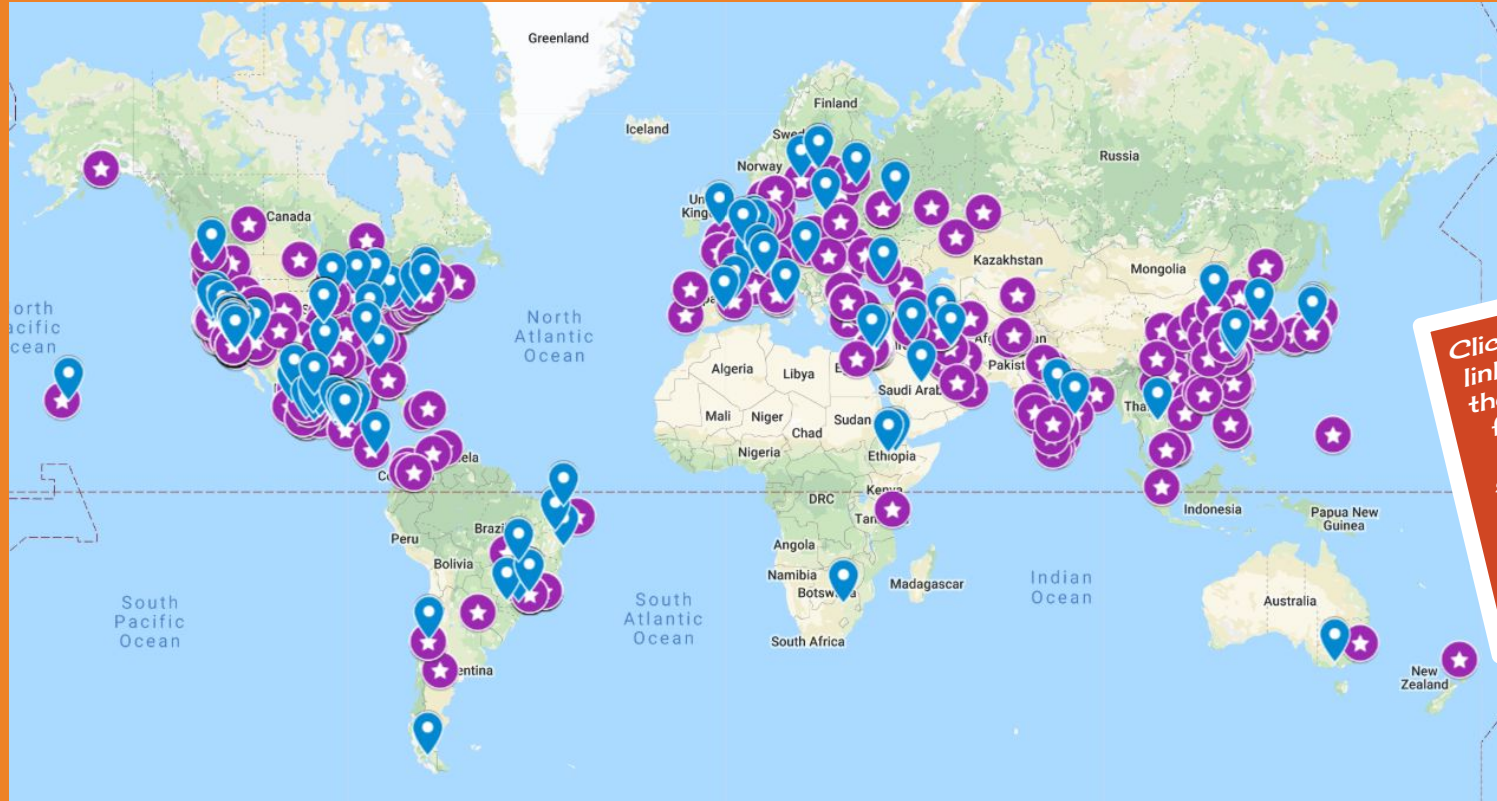

# What is the ELPAC?

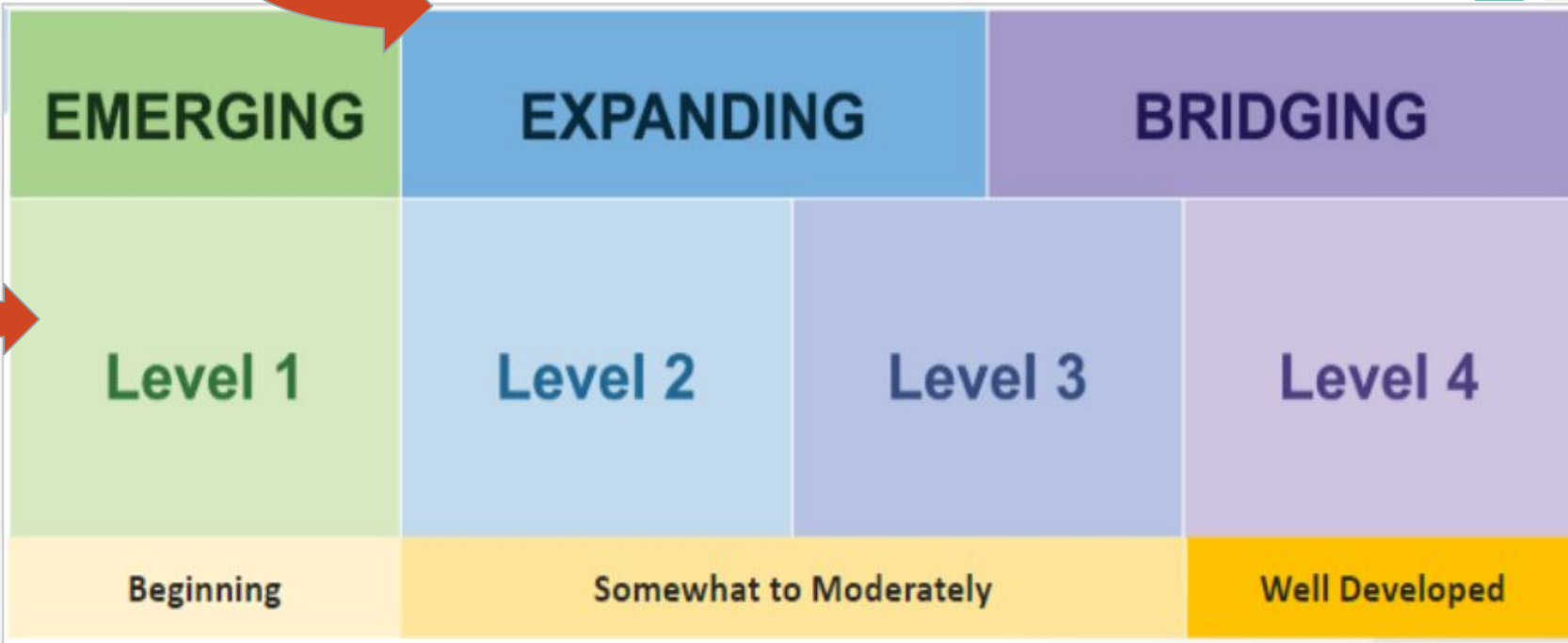
- The ELPAC is the English Language Proficiency Assessment for CA.
- ALL English Learners are required to take this test each year in February.
- Students must score a 4 (the highest score) to be eligible for reclassification.
- We appreciate the teachers allowing students to miss class for this test, and for cheering them on!
- The ELPAC tells us how well students are making progress in learning English and towards the rigorous goals of the CA ELD Standards.



*The CA English Language Development Standards are designed to:*

- Provide challenging content in English language development*
- Assist English Learners in gaining proficiency in a range of rigorous academic English language skills.*
